From Our Pastor!

April begins with "Fools' Day". What a concept, a day to play pranks and spread all manner of hoaxes, an official silly day to let imagination run riot. It's not my favorite day of the year and ironically, in 2024, it follows directly after my favorite day, Easter Sunday.

The origins of a special time for this unofficial "people's" holiday can be traced back to ancient Rome when several days were set aside at the end of March for the festival of Hilara (latin for joyful). People dressed in costumes that mocked local officials and had a good time pretending to be above their station.

For a brief period, New Year's Day was declared to be April 1 in 1582, but that switch didn't stick because many folk ignored this novel twist on their new Gregorian calendars. Eventually April 1 became the official date for no other reason than, why not? January 1 went back to being New Year's Day for no other reason than tradition.

Important Dates for April and May 2024:

The Great Fifty Days, also known as Eastertide or Easter Season, begins at sunset on Resurrection Eve and continues through Ascension Day to Pentecost Sunday.

Ascension Day is the 40th day after Christ's resurrection and therefore it's always on a Thursday. This year Ascension Day is Thursday, May 9th. Ten days later we celebrate Pentecost, May 19th in 2024.

The Great Fifty Days is a season of feasting and celebration of three great displays of God's redemptive love. God's love is shown in Christ's Resurrection, His Ascension into heaven, and the coming of the Holy Spirit, Who empowered and still empowers the Church for ministry.
