

From Our Pastor!

We enter the season of Advent with a sense of hope and purpose. At the same time, we recognize that fewer and fewer people around us share the abiding presence of our Savior Jesus Christ and our value system. We celebrate a season of joy, anticipating the anniversary of Christ's birth, while enduring a secular society with religious trappings pushed to the periphery.

Advent has changed from what it once was for a large segment of people in this country. In fact, Christmas has replaced Advent as the prevailing secular holiday season, nurtured by nostalgia and powered by commercialism. Lighted decorations and store displays push us towards a buying frenzy. People are in hope that St. Nick will soon visit and businesses pray that you will buy until your credit card is exhausted.

Santa Claus has actually replaced Christ. Attending Church on Christmas Eve is a tradition rather than a celebration of faith. Today we are as firmly held captive by Amazon and Apple as Israel was by Rome at Jesus' birth.

Across history Churches have had to recognize and deal with shifts in prevailing culture. Pervasive change comes slowly and is hardly recognized as taking place at any one point in time. But seen from the vantage point of decades and centuries, the changes are profound.

Consider the Danby Community Church culture of 200 plus years ago. Our church building has seen so much history pass by, that it boggles the mind. James Madison was President as our sanctuary was completed. The oak and pine timber above our heads were alive when Queen Elizabeth I was a girl. Attending Church was an all-day affair in the 1840s. Until 60 years ago Sunday was honored as a day of rest. Those ancient beams above our heads continue to hold our structure together as faith in Christ holds us in fellowship regardless of cultural norms. The Gospel of the Kingdom endures, no matter how hard folks have tried to bend and alter the truth of scripture and belief in Jesus Christ to suit their own desires. The Gospel of Jesus Christ remains the same.

Many are grieving losses at this time of year and the service is intended to help with the journey of grief.

The Christmas Eve service will be at 7:00 PM, Sunday evening, December 24th. **Christmas Day** is Monday, December 25th.

SPOC has also been reviewing the Danby Community Church Constitution and we are going to ask the membership at the annual meeting in January to consider changing the membership section of the constitution to more accurately define a partnership with the church.

Here is the new wording we would like to include in the constitution:

Article 4: Partnership

4.1 Persons become partners by baptism and either by confirmation or profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior before the congregation.

4.2 Partners shall be in community with one another, attend the regular worship activities of the Church and the celebration of the Lord's Supper; live the Christian life; share in the life and work of the church; contribute to its support and benevolences; and seek diligently the spiritual welfare of the partnership and the community.


4.3 The partnership roll shall be kept in the church office.

4.4 Each partner shall have one vote at the annual meeting or special meetings called by the administrative council.

4.5 Partnership with the church shall be renewed annually. At least once per calendar year every person in the congregation will have the opportunity to update their partnership covenant with the church.

In conclusion... Do you feel a spiritual calling or a desire to serve and want to do your part in expanding and building up God's Kingdom? Do you have a love for your community, faith and belief that we are doing God's work here in Danby Community Church, and desire personal growth in your spiritual life? Do you feel a sense of stewardship, have leadership skills, and/or feel a sense of duty to Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior?
