**Danby Community Church
Admin Council Meeting
January 11, 2021**

Present: Pastor Ed Enstine, Sheila Enstine, Paula Nelson, Margie VanDeMark, Dave McDermitt, Charlene Testut, Dale & Judy Horton, Gloria Miller. Pastor Ed opened the meeting with prayer at 6:57 pm.

CLERK'S MINUTES: Sheila pointed out that the correct term is "Operation Christmas Child" rather than "Christmas Child", under Spiritual Development. Motion by Gloria, second by Dale, to accept the minutes from December. Carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT: Dave presented his report. Margie made the motion, second by Gloria, to approve the financial report, carried.

TREASURER REPORT: Paula says we are still in good shape financially. She said Heifer Project had not been paid monthly so she sent \$600 in December for the whole year. She presented the spending plan for 2021. Increases occurred in church insurance and County waste fee. Since mobile food pantry did not operate here all of 2020 it was decided to decrease support by \$150. and review again in March for the next quarter. Charlene made the motion to approve the spending plan, time certain to the annual meeting. Gloria seconded the motion, carried.

OLD BUSINESS: Sheila asked about the clothing shed. Margie said no vandalism has occurred in winter and the plan is still on to build an inner wall. Sheila said she's having trouble locating Microban (for sanitization), and Charlene will help to search sources.

NEW BUSINESS: Lynn is assembling reports for the Annual Report and the Annual Meeting is postponed due to the pandemic. February 7 will be the due date for completion. Pastor Ed stated that there will be a small funeral here on January 16 for Vince Aiosa, only family and a few friends. A memorial will be held later in the spring at the Newfield School Aiosa Auditorium.

Hospitality: Charlene reported that coffee hours after church inside the Fellowship Hall are continuing to work well with social distancing being followed.

Spiritual Development: Sheila reported that Lent is beginning and Ash Wednesday is February 17. The Women's Study starts on February 19th. Youth Church will meet Feb. 14 and Feb. 28. She is thinking of conducting remote prayer vigils during Lent. Printed brochures are still available. Cards and calls ministry continues. Paula said three flowers arrangements will be sent this month.

Trustees: Charlene said the emergency food pantry will now be offered on the first Wednesday of each month. The idea is to provide staples two weeks after the regular food pantry. Charlene said there has been a roof leak and it will be addressed in spring. She said the exercise group is now meeting Tuesdays and Thursdays, and the Ukrainian Church also uses the church and is very appreciative.

Missions: Judy said she would like to see Lyn Aiosa's bible study group take her to lunch in a month or two when it's safe, including any others who would like to go to Rochester as well. The Healing Reigns Fellowship in Salamanca sent a thank you letter for the Christmas food and children's gift boxes. She said David Mastroberti has graciously offered items to them and will deliver them himself.

SPOC: Pastor Ed said they have had no meeting but plan to soon. Judy asked about church services being open when there is a spike in Covid cases. Pastor Ed said we are operating at the correct capacity and folks are following guidelines for safety.

SAP: No report.

Adjournment: Gloria made the motion, seconded by Dale, to adjourn. Pastor Ed closed the meeting with prayer at 7:57 pm.

Lenten Prayer Vigils:

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17th. To observe this forty day season of introspection and repentance, the Danby Church will host a series of virtual, 24-hour prayer vigils. The first will be on Friday, February 19th, the second is Friday, March 12th, and the third vigil will be on Good Friday, April 2nd. Details on how to participate are elsewhere in this newsletter.

Seven Life-Giving Virtues Conquer the Seven Deadly Sins

We all know that something has gone horribly wrong with our society. From lack of civility to outright mob violence, from institutional racism to homicide broadcast on the internet, from high rates of drug addiction to high rates of suicide, from international divisions and rivalries to outright civil war to an ongoing tsunami of refugees throughout the world, from environmental degradation to endemic diseases, to pandemics, the evidence that our culture and world is destroying itself is unavoidable.

Now I'm going to say something that will likely offend many people. So sit down and take a deep breath before reading further.

These indicators of destruction are not the cause of our troubles but rather the result of sin, and no one is innocent (see Romans 3:23.). Rather than deny our complicity, it's time for each of us to confess, repent, and commit to bringing virtue back into our lives and the world we live in.

Maybe you agree that we're all guilty of sin, but how does personal sin contribute to the world-wide disasters that are swirling around us? How can one person's or one group's repentance make a difference and where do we begin?

The answer to these questions can be found in learning from the spiritual giants upon whose shoulders we stand—Jesus of course, but also men and women like the desert abbas and abbesses of the 1st through 4th centuries. One of these was Evagrius the Solitary, a Christian monk who is credited with compiling what became known as the Seven Deadly Sins. The acronym PEWSLAG can help us remember the Deadly Seven:

Pride
Envy
Wrath
Sloth
Lust
Avarice
Gluttony

PEWSLAG sounds as nasty as it is, but the Seven Deadly Sins can be combated and conquered by using the Seven Virtues:

Humility
Creativity
Forgiveness
Diligence
Purity
Generosity
Temperance

Because the seven sins and the seven virtues are too complex for just one article, we will examine them in a series of discussions in future newsletters. For now, ask yourself how these sins have revealed themselves in your life, meditate on how they influence the moral decline of civilization, and pray about how the virtues can help lead you into a more joyful relationship with Christ as well as contribute to the healing of our nation and world.


