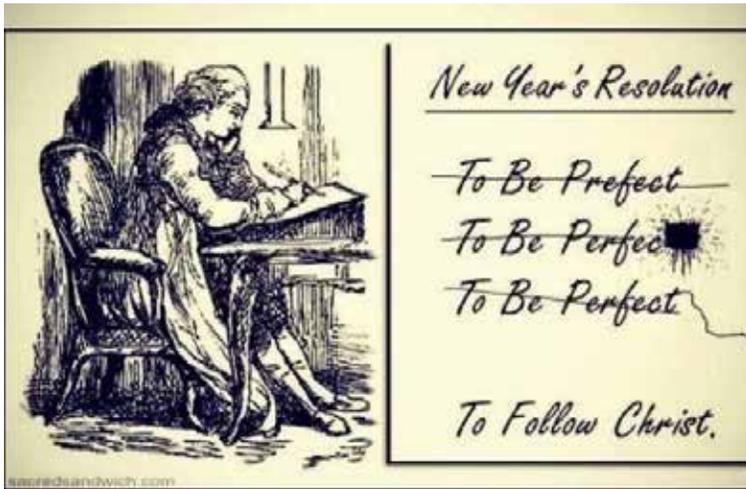

## A Meeting Minute

### News from your church leadership meetings

#### Administrative Council - December 2019 submitted by Margie VanDeMark, Council Secretary

**PRESENT:** Pastor Ed Enstine, Sheila Enstine, Margie VanDeMark, Judy Cuyle, Charlene Testut, Paula Nelson and Paul Schulz.

Paula called the meeting to order and Pastor Ed opened with prayer at 7:00 pm.

**CLERK'S MINUTES:** Motion by Judy, second by Sheila, to accept the minutes for November. Carried.

**FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT:** The men will need to have a meeting to decide whether to have a "Men's Fellowship" group. Paul made the motion, seconded by Charlene, to approve the Financial Secretary's report, carried.

**TREASURER REPORT:** Paula discussed the 2020 spending plan. Misc. expense will be reduced to \$1000 and "Christian Education" will be renamed "Spiritual Development" with Publications, Curriculum and Supplies each categorized. Motion by Margie, second by Charlene, to approve the report, carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Charlene made the motion that Council accept the recommendation that the Women's Fellowship be disbanded as decided at the special meeting yesterday(see minutes later in newsletter) Paul seconded the motion; carried by vote. Margie made the motion to approve the 2020 Spending Plan, seconded by Judy; carried.

Charlene reported that the new UMC Chancellor sent a proposal to our lawyers to split court costs for disbanding. Our lawyers will ensure that no property is involved.

Margie reported no further thefts in the clothing shed but the Sheriff was called by a client at the Mobile Food Pantry in November as her cart was taken from the line in the parking lot (she had left it.) Charlene reported that ten new rectangular tables have been purchased as five of ours had been broken.

**NEW BUSINESS:** The Christmas Eve collection was discussed. Judy made the motion, seconded by Margie, to give these monies to Hospicare, approved by vote.

**SPOC:** Judy said terms for all but two people were extended to continue their positions. The Council nominated Katy Prince to fill the SPOC vacancy. No one was nominated to fill the vacant Trustee position as eight people is enough.

**SAP:** Pastor Ed said the committee met informally regarding Advent. Into the New Year, a series on healthy qualities of a church will begin, then another NCD survey most likely will be done as it's been two years since the previous one.

At 8:12 pm Judy made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Margie. Pastor Ed closed our meeting with prayer.

# Pester the Pastor



## “What is the significance of the Wisemen at the birth of Christ and the gifts they brought?”

We only find reference to the Wisemen in Matthew 2: 1-12, but much has been made about who and where they came from, why they were looking for the baby Jesus and the gifts they brought.

The Bible does not tell us: The number of Wisemen, where they came from or their names.

They apparently came from the East. Magi once played a specific part of Persian culture. Daniel was appointed in charge over the Magi or wisemen in Babylon (Daniel 2:48). Perhaps his teachings on Judaism remained in the memories of the magi after 500 years. Many scholars believe the Magi were Zoroastrian priests, trained in both astrology and astronomy, who had wealth and influence enough to make a very long and dangerous journey to a foreign land.

The Magi were gentiles from Abraham’s home country, and they were monotheists looking for a savior like the Jews. That they would seek a new born King to honor is strange until you consider they saw a unique sign in heaven. The infant Jesus was something very special for all the world to see and worship.

Three perfect gifts fit for a King: the untarnished beauty of gold; the pure fragrance of frankincense; myrrh used to cure various ailments and in final application as perfume in embalming. No common birth would have exacted such tribute. Perhaps there is a point of irony in these precious gifts being given in recognition by gentile strangers, while the ruler of Jesus’ own people would seek to kill him. Jesus has inspired love or hatred, acceptance or rejection, from birth until today! Three perfect gifts fit for a King. The untarnished beauty of gold. The pure fragrance of frankincense and myrrh used as to cure various ailments and in final application as perfume in embalming. No common birth would have exacted such tribute. Perhaps there is a point of irony in these precious gift being given in recognition by gentile strangers while the ruler of Jesus’ own people would seek to kill him. Jesus has inspired love or hatred, acceptance or rejection from birth until today!

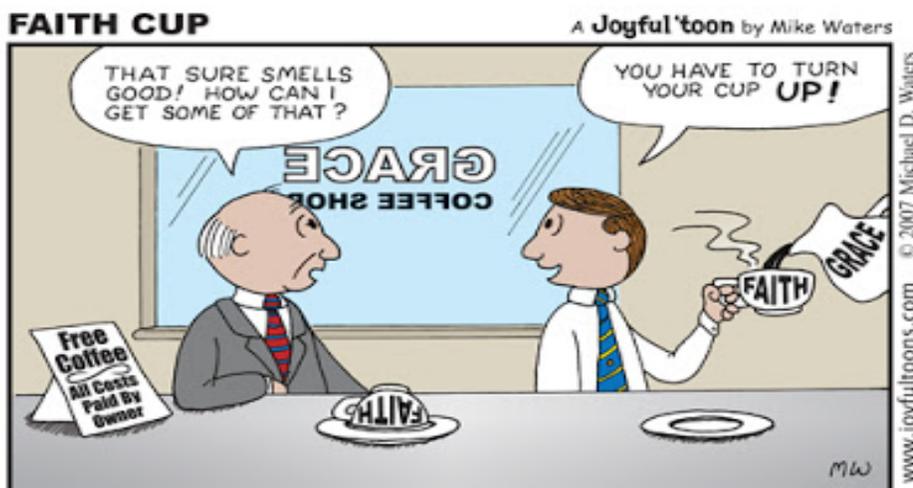

## Your Problem is Your Gift

One of my most rewarding volunteer experiences involved teaching decision-making skills to prison inmates. We had one lesson entitled “Choose Your Attitude!” As part of the lesson, we looked at how the challenges of life can also be opportunities or blessings.

Professionally, my work deals with weighty issues such as employment discrimination, disparities in the legal system, and workplace bullying – issues that impact the lives of some groups of people more than others. Nevertheless, we ALL have problems or burdens in our lives. Sometimes it’s tough to see the light at the end of the tunnel or the silver lining around the cloud.

Illness, betrayal, financial problems...life offers a whole host of challenges and daily opportunities to look at the gifts they represent.

*Your problem is your gift, your problem is your gift, your burden is a blessing and your problem in a gift.*

*What is the gift of adversity? What’s the good news about the stuff that can feel so bad?!*

I believe there are at LEAST three gifts in every problem situation. The three C’s: *Courage Compassion and Creativity*. Think about it. Any challenge you face gives you the opportunity to develop all of these gifts. Whether you do or not, is up to you.

**Courage** If you have survived cancer, for example, how fearful would you be of something like public speaking! Everything being relative, this would seem like a piece of cake, now!

**Compassion**...If you were a teenage mother, or raised by one, you are likely to have a more empathetic heart toward youngsters who find themselves in this situation, than the general public.

**Creativity**...Maybe you can relate to this situation, my dad, was raised on a small farm in a large family, and his parents were very creative when it came to finding a way to feed nine children. They were not the most glamorous meals, but no one ever went hungry!

Whatever the challenge, big or small, it offers the chance to develop courage, compassion, and creativity!

*Your problem is your gift, your problem is a gift, your burden is a blessing and your problem is a gift.*

Next time you have a situation to deal with that seems all bad, take a moment to reflect on how you might develop these gifts. As one of my favorite preachers, T.D. Jakes, says, “On the other side of the problem is the promise!”

I promise you, *nothing is all bad*, and on the flipside of the problem is a gift just for you!

## Why Attend a Prayer Vigil

“For we have no power to face this vast army that is attacking us. We do not know what to do, but our eyes are on you.’ All the men of Judah, with their wives and children and little ones, stood there before the LORD” (II Chronicles 20:12b-13).

“It was at this time that He went off to the mountain to pray, and He spent the whole night in prayer to God” (Luke 6:12).

“About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everyone’s chains came loose” (Acts 16:25-26).

The above passages are only a few examples of people—including Jesus—waiting and watching for God’s deliverance, presence, and guidance. Hundreds of other passages reveal the importance of dedicating hours and often entire nights in prayer vigils.

Consider the powerful results of prayer vigils. In II Chronicles, after the King of Judah led the people in a day of prayer and worship, the Lord caused the invading forces to destroy one another. Jesus’ overnight prayer in Luke 6:12 preceded choosing his Disciples, and after the earthquake in Acts 16, the jailer and his household converted to Christ.

You might be thinking I know that prayer is important, but why do I need to leave my comfortable, warm home and travel to another place to pray. I can pray at home or in the car while driving to work or the store.

Sure, you can do that. But how focused are your prayers in those circumstances? How intentional are they? Are you really able to avoid interruptions and distractions? How alert are you to the spiritual battles taking place in our world or within your own soul?

In past newsletters, I’ve described the lamentable condition of the culture we live in. Protests, power mongering, and secular politics make things worse. The only answer to “this present darkness” is committed, focused, intentional, pilgrimage prayer vigils. We will be holding a series of vigils in the Sanctuary, beginning with Lent 2020.

Please think about how you can be a part of this move of God.

## Women's Meeting Minutes

Paula Nelson opened the meeting at 11:25 and Sheila offered the prayer. Paula said that at last year's annual meeting it was stated that the Women's Fellowship had disbanded. Our Feb. 2017 organizational chart lists no men's nor women's fellowships. These now fall under hospitality or spirituality areas. If someone wants to organize an event, they should complete a form with the office and talk to the hospitality or spirituality coordinator.

There is now \$3523.33 (as of 11/30/19) set aside under "Women's Fellowship" in the pass through account that needs to be addressed. Below\* find the list of suggested missions from some of the former Women's Fellowship group who met informally. Bonnie Rathbun stated that they wanted to disperse monies raised to these missions plus leave a reserve to use for future events (Women's Tea, etc.). Sheila Enstine pointed out that from a fiduciary standpoint, such requests must be in the minutes of a meeting... there must be proof that a governing body approved the expenditures. Charlene (Hospitality Coordinator) said we are trying to streamline activities and fellowship. Sheila said we need to minister to one another holistically – our small groups should foster spirituality and fellowship. Events should be church-wide as that's how the community sees us. Bonnie feels there needs to be more communication between Council and groups. It was pointed out that all are welcome to attend regular publicized Council meetings. A motion was made by Donna Donnelly to eliminate the group "Women's Fellowship" - seconded by Gloria Miller, passed with 17 in favor and 3 opposed.

Regarding the list of missions to contribute to, Paula will take off General fund and the Indian School mission. Bonnie asked for \$200. for the Giving Tree project and Charlene made the motion that the \$200 to increase to \$300 if needed. Total missions listed amount to \$1850. Sharon Boda made the motion, seconded by Bonnie, to approve this spending, carried with none opposed. Charlene asked that we focus on fellowship rather than raising money.

Meeting adjourned at 11:58 pm.

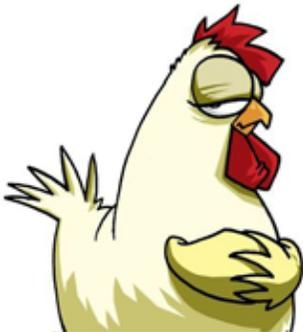
