



From Our Pastor!

Do we want to remain an independent church or is it time to look for a relationship with a denominational structure?

It was a good decision to break away from our dysfunctional relationships with our previous Federation partners. We have survived as an independent church through a very stressful time.

However, in the last two and a half years, we've experienced a season of mourning and isolation that, for me, highlights the value of a larger, supportive faith community.

Now it is time to consider our accountability, connection, and responsibility to the greater Kingdom of God. Future denominational affiliation is a question which we as a church need to examine and answer with prayer and careful discernment.

Over the course of our history, the Danby Community Church has been affiliated with several different denominations – Congregational, Presbyterian, United Methodist, and United Church of Christ. Presently we are an independent church.

There is an appeal to independence, but there is also a down side. In our independence, we lack accountability beyond ourselves. We lack outside resources to help in times of trouble or confusion. There is an intrinsic strength in collective wisdom, gained through connection with other men and women seeking God's will. As Proverbs 15:22 notes, "Plans fail for lack of counsel, but with many advisers they succeed."

Two questions need to be explored by our congregation:

1. Are we willing to seek a denominational partner?
2. If the answer is yes, who would be a proper fit for our current and future needs?

To address the elephant in the room, I am currently licensed by the Conservative Congregational Christian Conference or "4 Cs" for short. The word Conservative in their name is not a political term; it refers to "traditional."


**Got a burning question

Present. Sheila Enstine, Katy Prince, Gloria Miller, Judy & Dale Horton, Paula Nelson, Charlene Testut, and Dave McDermitt. Sheila opened with prayer at 7:01 pm.

CLERK'S MINUTES. August meeting minutes. Motion to approve (Katy), second (Gloria). Carried.

FINANCIAL SEC'Y REPORT: Dave gave report. Motion to approve (Dale), second (Gloria). Carried.

TREASURER REPORT: Paula gave report.

- Paula will transfer \$600 to the Heifer fund to fund our annual purchase from them.
- Sheila reported that she has been unable to reach the "Upper Room" by phone to reduce our subscription so she will see if they can be reached online. We will also publicize our subscription so new folks know we have the print versions available for the taking.
- Besides the annual report, the church's financial information is available on request.
- Motion to approve (Gloria), second (Judy). Carried.

OLD BUSINESS/Wrap-up:

- Safe Sanctuary training was held 8/16 and a make-up session on 9/08 for people who work with youth. This is to serve both as protection for our youth and for the adults who serve them against false allegations. Altogether, once reference checks are completed, there may be 18 volunteers. The safe sanctuary policy will be updated to include vulnerable adults.
- The Danby Summer Market on 8/19 was not well attended – not much foot traffic. So, there are no plans to have a church table at the September market (last one for the year), but folks are encouraged to go to meet your fellow Danby neighbors. Sheila made a nice connection with a neighbor.
- Biker Sunday was held. Katy reported that the bikers had a shorter ride over to Richford due to the weather though there was a longer ride the next day with an associated group. There was a problem with the grill, so we will purchase a new one. Thank you to Chrissy & Dan for spearheading!

- September 16th. Friday. Donuts & Coffee will be served in the morning as a way to invite the community to stop in. If it draws people, great, if not, we will discontinue it.

Though it hasn’t been held in 3 years, as many as 100 people have attended in the past.

- Highway cleanup of East King Rd for the fall will be advertised for a Saturday afternoon over the course of the next month or so.
- Lots of outreach ideas:
 - * discussion about sponsoring a bowling team or other team as an outreach event.
 - * Daryl is providing a witness and providing food and clothing needs though his backpack and school supplies program at a mobile home park in Newfield. Our mission as a church is to make disciples no matter where they are, so we would like to support this ministry even though its outside Danby. We provided hot dogs to one of his previous events there and may provide Christmas boxes there as the holiday approaches and the need is determined.
 - * Sheila has had a tough time trying to reach DSS downtown to figure out where the youth in Danby reside so she can contact them for needs. However, we may have access to needy students in the Newfield area so we may be able to provide for Danby youth if we had a similar list.
 - * Highway cleanup for East King rd. will be held one Saturday in the next few weeks.

SPOC:

- The committee met, and the pastor’s salary will have a cost-of-living (COLA) salary increase
- The committee will discuss nominations for vacancies on church boards and committees.

SAP: No meeting though Pastor Ed is glad to see more activity in the church.


The Ignatian Examen for Personal Prayer and Worship By Sheila Enstine

Last Month I introduced the Three Pillars of the Life of Grace: Passionate Worship, Study of the Word, and Grace-filled works.

I said that passionate worship is more than one hour on Sunday morning. “We prepare for that one hour on Sunday with personal worship during the week.”

Daily personal worship can include the same elements experienced in church, and just as the order of worship can change in congregational settings, so you can rearrange your own worship time.

However, beginning with praise is an essential first step. Jesus teaches us to do so in the Lord’s Prayer when he begins, “Our Father, who is in heaven, hallowed be your name” (Matthew 6:9), acknowledging God the Father as the ultimate, pure, and eternally good sovereign over our lives.



Many people follow an acronym like ACTS (adoration, confession, thanksgiving, supplication) or PRAY (praise, rest, ask, yield). In both of these examples, the worshipper begins with praise.

Another format is the Ignatian Examen. Developed by Saint Ignatius of Loyola in the 16th century, the Examen is a way to review your day and see what God is saying to you. The format does not stress “examination of conscience” as much as it emphasizes examining the last 24 hours to see “where God is waiving to you”, as one commentator said.

Followers of Ignatian spirituality have adapted St. Loyola’s original “Spiritual Exercises” to help modern worshippers deepen their relationships with God. If you would like more details, see the web site www.ignatianspirituality.com/ignatian-prayer/the-examen/.

The following five steps are compiled from the website and Jim Manney’s “A Simple Life-Changing Prayer” and should take 15 to 20 minutes. It can be used any time of day, but if you use the prayer in the morning, you would review the prior day.

Five Steps in the Ignatian Examen

1. Ask God for Light—I want to look at my day with God’s eyes, not merely my own.
2. Give Thanks—I Review the day with gratitude.
3. Review the Day—I carefully look back on the last 24 hours, being guided by the Holy Spirit. I Pay attention to my emotions.
4. Choose one feature of the day and pray from it—I face what is wrong, in my life and in me.
5. I look toward the day to come—I ask where I need God in the day to come.

Next month, we’ll look at another type of personal worship – the what, where, how and why of Christian meditation.
